Use "Quotation Marks" to Find Words as a Phrase

Use to switch to Wall Street Journal, etc.

### How to read a paper at a specific date (First identify the date in another source)

Example: *NYT* and *WSJ* coverage of the stock market crash in October 1929.

**NO search words needed**

Citation and article text

Date range:  On this date:

AND  Article Type:  (also, a good way to find major stories)

**Page View** << [Back to Results](#) Page  of 22 [Next >](#) to scroll through the pages

### How to find photos (there are few in *NYT* before 1910)

Search for:  in the  field.

AND  Article Type:

Before this date:

**Note-** This database only indexes 'standalone' photos, not those that accompany an article, which are the majority of the photos. Use **Lexis-Nexis** to search photo captions in issues from **1980 - present**, then go to that date and page in the **Historical *NYT*** to see the picture:

- After you click on LEXIS NEXIS, click on [Sources](#).
- Type in '*New York Times*', then click on [Find Title](#), then on [Search this Title](#)
